GUIDELINES FOR YOUR POSTER PRESENTATION Content

- 1. The main objective of the posters is to provide a basis for discussing your work (accomplished and future goals).
- 2. It's not necessary to provide a full account of what you did, or what you are planning.
- 3. Present the general conceptual idea, and highlight points you want input on.
- 4. Please provide a title of the poster <u>at least one week in advance of the conference start</u> to marta.andreatta@gmail.com

Form

- 1. Please use DIN A0 format portrait (approx. height = 119 cm; approx. width 84 cm) for the poster. It would be better, if the posters are a little bit smaller to make it possible to put 2 posters together on 1 board (measure of the poster boards: height=140 cm; width=120 cm).
- 2. It could be useful to put a picture of you, and probably of your PI(s) on the poster, to enhance identification of the author, allowing guests to approach you without knowing you (you can use the pictures from the GK-Homepage)
